Thought for the Week

I received an interesting email on Saturday. John Kirwan and his father had been removing an old fireplace in his new home in the late 1990s. It had previously been the property of the late Winifred Bailey. They discovered a Methodist Centenary Church Envelope dated Christmas Eve, 1933 (which happened to be a Sunday) behind the mantal piece. Inside the envelope was a 1930 silver sixpence from the reign of King George V (see below left). Sixpences were made from real silver until 1947. Irish and British coinage were of equal value and interchangeable at that time in Ireland. Mr Kirwan estimated that the equivalent monetary value of the sixpence in today's money would be €30. One wonders if anyone was blamed for stealing the envelope!





Eric Rankin and I met John at Wesley House on Monday morning at 11am (above right). He felt that the artifact might be of interest and he has given it to the congregation. We were delighted with the gift. It reminded me of the story that Jesus told of a woman who had ten silver coins and lost one. She turned the house upside down to find it. Not only was a drachma worth a day's wages, it would have been part of her dowry, worn like a wedding ring on a string across her forehead. To be missing one would indicate that the family was going through hard times, suggesting that her husband was not providing for the family adequately. It would have been like losing a front tooth! Everyone would notice.

This is a great illustration of the value that God places on each one of his children. The Hebrew Scriptures also emphasise this. Every migrant, orphan and widow is precious.

This Sunday from 10.,30am until 2pm is our Back to Church Sunday following extensive renovations. Elaine Barnett, Lay Leader of the Methodist Church in Ireland will address us in our all age service and officially reopen the building. We will hear about the work and celebrate together over a meal and a party. Every member of our community is equally important. I hope that you can be there.

Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A tax payer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.32, and pro rata for donations of over €250.
