

# Final service in Christ Church, Leeson Park Friday 7th March 2.00pm

Having fulfilled a glorious purpose in facilitating worship and supporting the female blind and other beautiful ministries in the area, Christ Church is to be sold. Our Romanian Orthodox friends have vacated the building, but are likely to be among the interested parties. As a Methodist congregation we are grateful that we were able to sojourn and worship in that building for a number of years while also developing Wesley House for the benefit of both congregations. As such we are all warmly invited by Canon Andrew McCroskery to a service of Holy Communion at 2pm on Friday 7th March. Such is the interest that the Centenary Hall has been requested for refreshments for a substantial congregation following the service.



There are many interesting stained glass windows in Christ Church and Canon McCroskery is kindly opening the Church at 1.40pm to give us a chance to examine their messages. I think that the window in this photograph is particularly beautiful. It is in memory of Mary Hyndman who died in 1872. The two scenes depicting the wife of a noble character from Proverbs 31 are from a theme often captured in glass by children and husbands thankful for a much loved mother. The text on the right is more unusual. Job was being accused by his 'comforters' of getting the suffering that he deserved for his sins. He protested, 'I was eyes to the blind and feet for the lame' (Job 29:15). Mary Hyndman would have been one of many who helped care for the female blind in the Molyneaux home, enabling them to develop skills, live full lives, and find true comfort in God. # Thought for the Week The sweet, and the bitter

Today is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent. Yesterday, on Shrove Tuesday, we may have had pancakes, a tradition whereby Christians eat the fatty and sweet food in their larders in preparation for 40 days of prayer and fasting. As children we loved Shrove Tuesday. My mother, and then Jean, make very good pancakes that are then enhanced by the tartness of lemon juice and the sweetness of sugar.

As Lent begins we direct our thoughts to the Judean wilderness; a dry, hard and stony place with deep valleys and dangerous escarpments. It is the place where the shepherd David encountered the valley of the shadow of death and the place where Jesus located the parable of the Good Samaritan. It is here that John the Baptist calls us to repent and to turn our attention to God and where our Lord Jesus overcame the temptation to take the easy road, and where he found the solitude and silence to prepare for ministry, death, and the redemption of humanity and the cosmos.

I pray that our prayers during Lent will include both the sweetness of thanksgiving and the agony of intercession at a time when the world is becoming increasingly unsettled.

Christ has conquered evil, and we thank him for his forgiveness and his communion. When he was in the wilderness, he was 'with the wild animals, and the angels attended him'. Those wild animals are symbols of his coming kingdom where all creation will live in peace and harmony.

### St Patrick's Day



#### **Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme**

A taxpayer who contributes €250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover €112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to €362.82, and pro rata for donations of over €250. This scheme brought in over €17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
