Service of worship with Rev Andrew Kingston

Rathfarnham Castle walk Friday 21st March, 11am

This is a repeat of the walk that Eric Rankin led recently. A number of people were disappointed to miss the last walk. The entrance fee is €4. Meet at the reception area in the Castle. Included in the historical tour is a ceramics exhibition and an exhibition of photographs of David Bowie. Refreshments will be available after the tour at the cafe on the premises.

Two peaks and two Estates walk, Saturday 29th March, 10.30am

This walk will introduce Marius and Danielle to their new surroundings in Bray. Meet at Wesley House at 9.30am, or in the main Kilruddery Car Park by Squirrel's Scramble at 10.30am. This fabulous walk includes Bray Head and Little Sugarloaf. We will walk down the drive past the pigsties before crossing the road into Manweiler's Wood and Bray Head. We then make our way along the summit with its spectacular views over Greystones before walking a stretch of quiet country road into Belmont Estate, Little Sugarloaf and back to the car park through terrain made familiar by Ireland's Fittest Family. The walk is approximately 8k with substantial elevations and we will be maintaining a moderate pace.

Thought for the Week

We were shocked this week by new lows plummeted by world leaders. Trump, the President of the most powerful nation in the world, welcomed a convicted rapist and racist to the Whitehouse on St Patrick's Day. Israel killed hundreds of women and children by bombing completely defenceless refugees trapped like fish in a barrel in Gaza. Meanwhile Trump and Putin cravenly discuss carving up Ukraine's land, assets and powerplants. Our Lectionary readings for Sunday focus on the topic of the judgement of God. The life of Jesus was constantly under threat by the despot Herod. Yet he said, 'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather be afraid of the One who can destroy both body and soul in hell'.

The most troubling parable that Jesus told did not address sins of brutality, but rather sins of omission (see Luke 16:19-30). He talked about someone who lived in relative luxury compared with the poor of the world who were represented by a destitute man called Lazarus begging on the street outside his gated residence. The dogs who licked his sores showed more compassion to Lazarus than the rich man who walked past him every day.

Kenneth Bailey in his book Jesus through Middle Eastern Eyes says that the licking of dogs was known to aid healing. Both of these men died. The rich man went to hell and Lazarus was carried by angels to a place of honour in heaven beside Abraham, the man of hospitality. In hell the merciless now sought mercy, but would receive none because the time of God's favour had passed. He was given ample opportunities to speak up for the oppressed, to act, to show mercy and to trust in God during his lifetime. Being silent, passive and ignoring the plight of others is no excuse in the sight of God. 'Whoever has ears to hear, let them hear'.

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8



Tax Back Tax Relief Scheme

A taxpayer who contributes \notin 250 to the church in a year enables the church to recover \notin 112.82 from the Revenue Commissioners thereby increasing the donation to \notin 362.82, and pro rata for donations of over \notin 250. This scheme brought in over \notin 17,000 last year. To register, you need an envelope number and a CHY3 form from Lynne Pasley. This latter is valid for 5 years and doesn't commit you to make any future donations.
